## **Colonel Robert Bodisch, USMC**

A second-generation Marine, Rob Bodisch received his commission and Bachelor of Arts degree in History from Texas A & M University in December 1996. After completion of the Basic School, Armor Officer and Platoon Leader Courses, the Intelligence Officer's Course and Weapons and Tactics Instructor Course, he served as a Platoon Commander and Company Executive Officer in 1<sup>st</sup> Tank Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> Marine Division, Twenty-nine Palms, Calif.; as an Intelligence Officer at 1<sup>st</sup> Marine Aircraft Wing; as Security Manager for Marine Air Group 36 in Okinawa, Japan; and deploying as an Operations Planner with USCENTCOM Coalition Forces in support of Operation Enduring



Freedom. In 2004-5 after graduating from Expeditionary Warfare School he was assigned to 2<sup>nd</sup> Tank Battalion, 2<sup>nd</sup> Marine Division, Camp Lejeune, N.C. where he served as Commander of Company C, deploying his Tank Company to Fallujah, Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

From 2006-2009 Bodisch completed a joint assignment as an Intelligence Officer with Joint Task Force North, USNORTHCOM, Fort Bliss, Texas supporting numerous federal agencies along both U.S. borders. Following this assignment, he completed the US Army Command & General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kan. and earned a Master of Arts degree in International Relations from Webster University.

From 2010-2013 he was assigned to 2nd Tank Battalion serving as Executive Officer and deploying as a Campaign Planner with International Security Assistance Force Joint Command in Afghanistan, and later as the Somalia Strategic Planner with Combined Joint Task Force–Horn of Africa at Camp Lemonier, Djibouti. Upon his return he was assigned as the Future Operations Officer at 2nd Marine Division.

From 2013-2014, Bodisch was assigned to the Marine Corps Combat Development Command in Quantico, Va. where he was selected for command and then returned to  $2^{nd}$  Tank Battalion from 2014-2016. Upon completion of his command assignment, he graduated from the Naval War College in Newport, R.I. with a Master of Arts Degree in National Security and Strategic Studies.

From 2017-2019, Bodisch was assigned as an instructor at the Air War College at Maxwell AFB, Ala. From 2019-2020, he was assigned to 3rd Marine Expeditionary Force, Okinawa, Japan as the Strategic and Future Plans Officer and later as the Officer-In-Charge of the Joint COVID-19 Response Center. From 2020-2022, Colonel Bodisch served as the Commanding Officer of the Combined Arms Training Center at Camp Fuji, Japan prior to his current assignment.

Colonel Bodish and his wife, Kelli, have 5 Children.
