

Denver Council January 19th Dinner Meeting Hosting Dr. Chris Juergens, Ph.D. of History **Colorado and Honoring Top Performers of the U.S. Coast Guard Cryptologic Unit**

### Dr. Chris Juergens, Ph.D. Head Curatorial Services and Anschutz Curator of **Military History at History Colorado**

Dr. Chris Juergens is the Head of Curatorial Services and the Anschutz Curator of Military History at History Colorado. Here he oversees the state's extensive military collections, ensuring this important history is appropriately collected, preserved, and shared. In his free time, he is also an Adjunct Professor in the Department of Strategy and Policy at the United States Naval War College.

Dr. Juergens will discuss the "Military History Collections at History Colorado." This talk will broadly discuss the types of stories held in the state collection at History

Colorado, the methods of collecting artifacts, the strengths and weaknesses of the collection, and plans for the coming year. Also provided will be an overview of recent high-profile work in the collection, including the newest exhibit, Winter Warriors, and ongoing work surrounding the service of the WWII battleship, USS Colorado BB-45.

U.S. Marine Corps Reserve, by bringing a variety of new, unwrapped toys to the November meeting.



During the November drill, the cadets headed to Camp Timberline near Estes Park for their annual camp weekend. After arriving at the camp, cadets unloaded the vans, put away their sea bags and ate chow. They then

tackled and filled the afternoon with the ropes course and jumping off the platform. The platform jump taught the cadets about parajumping. For many cadets, it was their first time making the jump but with so much support from their fellow cadets, no one backed out of their jumps.

After the ropes course and a warmup indoors, the cadets divided into three groups, each rotating through three different classes for the rest of the afternoon. Classes included Land Navigation (Land Navs), Radio

Communications (Radio Coms) and Field Operations (Field Ops), all of which were designed to help the cadets prepare for their nighttime field operations missions.

At sundown, cadets were divided into three groups and given a location they were required to achieve without being ambushed. There were three ambush parties consisting of Sea Cadet unit leaders. The three cadet groups were sent to different locations while the ambush parties went out to find their targets.

All three groups successfully completed their missions. Arriving back at the lodge, the cadets were treated to homemade hot chocolate while they debriefed their missions before heading to bed.

a Physical Training session (field hockey) and morning chow, the cadets were divided into five groups, with counselors who led them in the many tasks necessary to close the camp. Cadets helped move wooden benches to the barn for winter storage.


