

LT. CMDR. Ryan "ROOMBA" Salcido

Lt. Cmdr. Salcido is a native of southern California and earned his degree from Miami University of Ohio. He enlisted as an Avionics Technician and received a commission through Officer Candidate School. Initially designated as a Naval Flight Officer, he earned his Information Warfare qualification and was re-designated as a Maritime Space Officer within the Information Warfare Community in 2022.

Afloat assignments include aircraft squadron deployments aboard four different aircraft carriers, three of

which involved the first three deployments of the new EA-18G electronic warfare plane and one involved supporting Operations New Dawn and Enduring Freedom. During his Department Head Tour on the staff of Battle Force SEVENTH Fleet, he served as the Operations, Administrative and Safety Officer for Carrier Air Wing-2 aboard USS Carl Vinson (CVN 70).



Ashore and joint assignments include: Joint Reconnaissance Officer in All-source Operations for the U.S. Indo-Pacific Command; Operations Officer at Naval Support Activity, Souda Bay, Crete where he oversaw the Navy's air and sea support of U.S. allies and coalition forces operating within the European Command, African Command and Central Command areas of responsibility and his current assignment at U.S. Space Command as the Branch Chief for Orbital Warfare requirements and Executive Officer of the Naval Element.

Lt. Cmdr. Salcido is a qualified Aviation Safety Officer, holds a certificate in Network Operations from Naval Postgraduate School, is a Defense Intelligence Agency certificated Collection Manager and has completed his Joint Professional Military academics via the US-MC's Command and Staff College.



USS Colorado Commanding Officer, Cmdr. David Beam, informed the Association that after a stand down period following their recent deployment, they have



been at sea for some sonar testing and an Arctic Operations Certification. They will then have a final maintenance availability before sailing over the North Pole to Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard near Honolulu, Hawaii for an extended maintenance period. Cmdr. Beam also informed Association members that the crew loved the deployment coins from the Association and greatly appreciated their support upon the crew's return from deployment.

Association members offered congratulations to Cmdr. Beam and the crew of USS Colorado on their winning the Battle "E" for their Squadron. The Battle "E" is awarded to the submarine in each squadron rated number one in warfighting readiness. Addition-

ally, the crew won the Medical "M", Cyber "C", Navigation "N", and Supply "S" awards for excellence in these categories.



Sea Cadet Update

December Drill: Although sea cadet support of Wreaths Across America Foundation work at Fort Logan National Cemetery in December was touched upon in the January newsletter, a more detailed



report is warranted. The December drill started at 0630 for eight cadets arriving at the cemetery to help unload wreaths. By 0830 another 38 cadets arrived to help distribute and place the wreaths on thousands of deceased veterans' graves. They teamed with two Colorado Young Marine Units and one Civil Air Patrol Unit to accomplish the overall mission with hard work and great attitudes for which they received many compliments from the other military youth groups.

After Fort Logan, the cadets returned to the Navy Operational Support Center Denver (NOSC) and began with uniform inspections, PRT's and practicing everything League and Sea Cadet related. Aviation Training group headed to the Wings Over the Rockies Museum at Lowry to complete their final drone training activity. When they returned, they spent some time flying drones so they could practice the skills they had learned.



The December drill ended on Sunday with a gift exchange and holiday party where the drill deck was packed with cadets, parents, siblings, special guests and delicious food.

January Drill: Part of the January drill was canceled due to bad weather but cadets and parents stayed flexible and changed plans as needed. The cadets met at the VFW in Bennett and then headed to the community pool for swim qualifications practice. Cadets must be able to swim in shallow water, in chest deep water and deep water, tread water and prone float. There are four levels to attain: Basic Swimmer, Third Class



Swimmer, Second Class Swimmer and First Class Swimmer.

After swimming practice, the cadets returned to the NOSC to work on Color Guard drills and prepare for the annual inspection in February. Cadets practiced their required knowledge concepts such as the Eleven General Orders and the Sea Cadet Oath. Cadets checked their dress blues for proper fit and required items. They also updated ribbon racks.

The unit placed ninth in the nation last year; this year the goal is to place in the top five for 2024. Good luck Lexington Division and Training Ship Colorado!

<u>Wreaths Out Day</u>: Eleven League Cadets and Sea Cadets showed up at Fort Logan National Cemetery on a January morning to help remove and dispose of over 10,000 wreaths!

Lexington Division & Training Ship Colorado were successful in meeting their Wreaths Across America goal for 2023. Their goal for 2024 is 400 wreaths but we hope to have this all sponsored before the November deadline. Wreaths can be sponsored at any time during the year. 
